## Reading for Betterment Expanding minds"

Reading is an essential life skill that all of our children should be supported with. Our philosophy of 'reading for betterment' places reading right at the centre of our curriculum. We aim to nurture and inspire all students to become life-long readers.

We read together twice per week for 20 minutes; enjoying a vast array of novels which expose students to a variety of genres. We actively encourage literacy skills within our classrooms through our 6 Pillars of Literacy.



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## Oracy "Our voices are heard"

Our students are empowered to use their voice for success in school and in life. We teach them to become more effective speakers and listeners and in doing so we encourage them to better understand themselves, each other and the world around them. Our students are encouraged to actively participate in lessons through debate and enquiry. We offer a wide variety of oracy-based opportunities e.g. 'Make yourself heard', 'Debate Mate' and Student Council. Students from all years participate in annual elections for Halton and Trust-wide representation.

#### **Staying Safe Online**

The internet can be an interesting and fun place to spend time, it can also be a dangerous place if you are not sensible and/or don't know how to stay safe online. We actively teach our students about personal security guidelines, which includes: Never revealing personal information, about themselves or others, such as home addresses, telephone numbers and personal e-mail addresses etc. Never using photographs of themselves on their web pages unless parents/guardians have given permission to do so. Never meeting people in person that they have contacted on the internet without a parent/guardian's permission. Notify their teacher whenever they come across information that appears dangerous, inappropriate,

or makes them feel uncomfortable. Be aware that the author of an e-mail or web page may not be the person they claim to be.

#### **Digital Safeguarding**

We teach our students how to keep safe online through their Personal Development and Computer Science schemes. We ask parents to be vigilant ensuring their child is safe online; we support this via Synergy and our social media platforms.

#### Medicines

If your child is required to take prescribed medication, we ask that these are brought in and handed to reception with a completed a form. If a student is on prescription medication which they must take daily, we ask you keep enough in stock both at home and in school. Your child should not have any medication on their person; it must be stored securely.

#### Nut free school

Please ensure you do not send any nut based products into school due to students with severe allergies.

#### Aerosol free

Students must bring in roll on deodorant or non-aerosol sprays, to support other students with asthma or breathing difficulties.

Money can be paid via Parentmail for students to be able to buy their school lunches, print documents or pay for trips or visits.

Parents are asked to contact form tutors or reception as their first port of call.





Students can purchase a locker for a deposit of £10 so lunch and PE kits can be stored in there until needed.

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
